PROTOCOL 4th PARLIAMENTARY SITTING OF ASGARDIA 16-18 TAURUS 0003 (10-12 APRIL 2019)

TYPE AND LOCATION

The 4th Parliamentary Sitting of Asgardia was held on 16-18 April 0003 (10-12 April 2019) in the form of digital presence, using platforms ZOOM, SLACK and the electronic voting system of Asgardia.

### REGISTRATION AND QUORUM

Registration was carried out on the digital platform of Asgardia.

At the time of the registration, the Parliament constituted 110 members (AMPs), who were authorized to be admitted to registration and voting.

Registration, corresponding to the report of the Mandate Commission 102 parliamentarians (AMPs), was 92,72%, exceeding the required quorum total of 50% + 1 Asgardian Members of Parliament.

The quorum was achieved.

Parliamentary sessions must be conducted in person or virtually, and in every Asgardian year, there must be a minimum of 4 (four) and a maximum of 13 (thirteen) sessions.

After the Provision is developed, present the according amendments to the Act on Acts for the review by Parliament.

11. To replace in subsection 6 of section 12 of the Citizenship Law:

The Certificate of Citizenship is issued to a physical person within a reasonable period of time, if the conditions of items (2), (3), (4) and (5) of the current section have been met.

With the following language:

- a. The Certificate of Citizenship is issued to a physical person within a reasonable period of time as determined by the Government of Asgardia, if conditions of items (2), (3), (4) and (5) of the current section have been met and the individual has been granted citizenship in Asgardia.
- b. The Certificate of Citizenship is the confirmation of Asgardian citizenship. A one- time fee in the amount of €1,000 is collected by the Government of Asgardia from every applicant for Asgardian citizenship, except current members of parliament and government. The Government of Asgardia determines the procedure of granting citizenship in Asgardia, the order of issuing the Certificate of Citizenship, and has the right to propose to the Parliament changes to the amount of the fee at its own discretion.
- c. The total number of issued Certificates of Citizenship cannot exceed 150 million.

At the present time, the proposed legislation has not been presented in full scope by the Ministry of Finance.

11.Amendments to the Act on Acts and the Citizenship Law:

11.1.To section 13 of the Act on Acts, add a subsection 7:

Every voting is conducted by openballot for all parliamentarians.

11.2. In subsection 3(b) of section 13 of the Act on Acts, replace:

Virtual sitting shall last for a period of 72 (seventy-two) hours to allow for all Members of Parliament to vote during this period.

With the following language:

Virtual sitting shall last 48 (forty-eight) hours to allow for all Members of Parliament to vote during this period.

11.3. In subsection 1 of section 13 of the Act on Acts, replace:

Parliamentary sitting shall be conducted physically or virtually, and there shall be a minimum of 7 [seven] and a maximum of 13 [thirteen] sittings in each Asgardian year. With the following language:

Parliamentary sitting shall be conducted physically or virtually, and there shall be a minimum of 4 [four] and a maximum of 13 [thirteen] sittings in each Asgardian year.

11.4. Establish procedures for Parliamentary queries and for holding Parliamentary hearings.

1) Acknowledge the practicability of establishing procedures for Parliamentary queries and for holding Parliamentary hearings.

2) Task the Justice Committee, together with interested parliamentarians, with preparing the Provision for Parliamentary queries and Parliamentary hearings procedures.

3) After the Provision is developed, present the according amendments to the Act on Acts for the review byParliament.

11.5. In subsection 6 of section 12 of the Citizenship Law, replace:

A certificate of citizenship shall be granted to an individual within reasonable time, if the conditions in sub-sections (2), (3), (4) and (5) of this section are met.

With the following language:

a. TheCertificate of Citizenship is issued to a physical person within a reasonable period of time as determined by the Government of Asgardia, if conditions of items (2), (3),

(4) and (5) of the current section have been met and the individual has been granted citizenship in Asgardia.

b. The Certificate of Citizenship is the confirmation of Asgardian citizenship. A one-time fee in the amount of €1,000 is collected by the Government of Asgardia from every applicant for Asgardian citizenship, except current members of parliament and government. The Government of Asgardia determines the procedure of granting citizenship in Asgardia, the order of issuing the Certificate of Citizenship, and has the right to propose to the Parliament changes to theamount of the fee at its owndiscretion.

c. The total number of issued Certificates of Citizenship cannot exceed 150 million.

12. Confirming the suggested list of top-priority laws in accordance with the Constitution. Confirm the following suggested list of top-priority laws in accordance with the Constitution.

The laws must be developed and, after development, adopted by Parliament:

1. National Currency Law - Article 13 (3,4) of the Constitution. (Plans to present the proposed legislation areunderway)

2. National Bank Law - Article 39 (1) of the Constitution. (Plans to present the proposed legislation areunderway)

3. Tax Law - Article 9 (5) of the Constitution.

4. Electoral Law – Articles 9 (6), 16 (7), 32 (4,6,7), 33 (2), 44, 46, 49 of the Constitution.

5. The Law on Powers and Procedure of State Bodies - Article 30 (4) of the Constitution.

6. Private Business Law – Articles 6 (5), 9 (10) of the Constitution.

7. Government Information Disclosure Law - Article 16 (6(g)) of the Constitution.

8. Social Protection Law - Article 20 (2) of the Constitution.

9. Information Safety and Security Law – Articles 22 (6), 23 (3) of the Constitution.

10. Asgardian Language Law - Article 27 (2) of the Constitution.

11. Capitals of Asgardia Law - Article 28 (5) of the Constitution.

12. Asgardian Calendar Law

13. Parliamentary by-elections with an open date – the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter

To prevent a decrease in the number of Members of Parliament below the number determined necessary for quorum in accordance with the Constitution of Asgardia and the Act on Acts, a decision on parliamentary by-elections must be made in the 4th quarter or later. The exact date and regulations of the by-elections will be determined by the Chair of Parliament or the Head of Nation.
